“We are extremely proud to have received these ratings which are reserved for wines of the highest quality. The Apex Chardonnay received a rating of 96 and the Gewurztraminer a 94”.

We are particularly pleased with the results for our flagship wine, the Apex Orange Chardonnay, one of only two chardonnays in the Orange district to have received 96 points, a score which is also the equal highest from all varieties in the region.

The gewürztraminer is also a stand out and is described as having 'more varietal fragrance than any gewürztraminer tasted for years'. The review highlights the great match of this wine with Asian food and at a retail price of \$22, we believe it represents outstanding value.

PINOT GRIS + GRIGIO

Pinot Grigio and Pinot Gris are the same variety - the differences comes down to a matter of production and style. By definition pinot grigio is the lighter, more delicate expression from Italy's north-east corner. Grapes are often picked early to maintain high levels of natural acidity, while production occurs quickly to capitalise on freshness and zing.

The French equivalent is pinot gris where riper fruit, coupled with a more 'hands-on' approach to winemaking has a tendency to produce fatter, richer wines.

SEMILLON + BLENDS

Semillon is native to France's Bordeaux region, however it is here in Oz, particularly the Hunter, where Semillon has had the greatest amount of success. Great examples of young wines explode with pear, white peach and other ripe summer fruits. Wines with 5-10 years of age have intense citrus fruit, marmalade and a toasty honey, nutty and spicy complexity.

WHITE VARIETALS AND BLENDS

Albarino

A native to Spanish Galicia. The style lies somewhere between Riesling and Viognier, with heaps of ripe citrus, plenty of zing, and aromas of apricot, flowers and sweet spice

Gewurztraminer

This Alsatian native comes complete with a highly distinctive and exotic array of aromas including lychees, rose petals, orange blossom, musk, ginger and Turkish delight. Fantastic as an aperitif or with anything spicy

Roussanne

From the Rhone Valley, these wines are all about subtle aromatics and textures. Pears, apricots, herbal tea and spice.

Vermentino

This is a late-ripening variety more commonly found in Italy. Perfectly geared for Spring and Summer drinking, they are delicate with smells of green herb, lemon rind and jasmine flowers.

Viognier

From the Rhone Valley, a hugely aromatic wine with smells of white peach, apricots, orange rind, blossom and fresh-cut flowers. The wines tend to be on the oily side, with great length and soft acidity.

CHARDONNAY

Chardonnay first came to Australia in the 1920's and is the number one selling white wine in Australia. The biggest mistake anyone can make is to think all Chardonnays are the same. Orange region Chardonnay is outstanding and the regions best and most consistent white variety. Great examples from cool regions like Orange are Chablis-like and more subtle, with hints of vanilla, white peach and citrus (grapefruit and lime characters) predominating. Try a Chardonnay on our list today, you are sure not to be disappointed.

ROSE

The most popular variety in France, most rose wines are made from red grapes in much the same way red wines are except their skins are allowed to soak with the grape juice for only a short time, just enough to get a delicious pink tint. Dry styles are often made from Pinot Noir, Cabernet Franc, while sweeter styles are often made from Merlot. Perfect for summer drinking in our courtyard.

PINOT NOIR

Pinot Noir is the fastest growing red variety in Australia. While it can be finicky for the winemaker, the result is certainly worth it. Pinot Noir traditionally from Burgundy in France, New World Pinot Noirs from Oregon, Central Otago and the cool climate regions of Australia are fast gaining world wine acclaim. Expect sumptuous velvety textures and flavours

MERLOT AND BLENDS

Grown and made throughout the world, it is widely used in Bordeaux, France. Expect smooth, fruit flavours of red and black cherry, berry, plus red currant with hints of spice, tobacco and licorice. Similar to Pinot Noir, Merlot is also a fickle variety and flavours can vary widely from vineyard to vineyard.

Drink with grilled red meats stews tuna or swordfish.

RED VARIETALS AND BLENDS

Sangiovese

The star of Tuscany and a grape that plays a large role in Chianti. Expect a deep-coloured wine that is lighter in texture and flavour and more savoury than Cabernet Sauvignon.

Superb with pasta dishes grilled meats and antipasto plates.

Barbera

Often called 'the people's wine' of Piedmont, Barbera is a crisp and easy to drink wine, with a deep ruby colour berry flavours a medium body refreshing acidity and low tannin levels.

Nebbiolo

The leading grape from Piedmont (Italy) a bigger wine than Sangiovese, expect flavours of cherry rose tobacco and tar.

Grenache

Widespread in the Rhone region of France and also the Barossa Valley full fruity with wet earth plums and hints of leather.

Malbec

The star grape of Argentina expect juicy deep fruit flavours such as raspberry with hints of coffee and cinnamon.

CABERNET AND BLENDS

Often referred to as the 'noble' grape, Cabernet Sauvignon is the king of French wine grapes. Wines can range from opulent to elegant and smooth. Expect intense, dark-fruit flavours and fruit aromas. The cool climate Cabernets from Orange tend to have more finesse and aromatic delicacy, but still have plenty of ripeness and power on the palate. Blends of Cabernet are traditional and may include Cabernet Franc and Merlot. Such blends are known for their finesse and high quality as well as cellaring potential

SHIRAZ

Syrah originates in the Rhone region of France. In Australia most Syrah is referred to as Shiraz and it's the most commonly planted variety. Shiraz at best oozes smells of blood plums, raspberries, earth, cedar and freshly ground pepper. Those labelled Syrah tend to be from the cooler climates and are lighter in body with aromatics ranging from red currants to raspberries and plums, always with plenty of pepper.

SHIRAZ-VIOGNIER

While the French have used Viognier in their Syrah for years, in Australia actually naming it on the bottle has become increasingly popular. Shiraz is either co-fermented with Viognier or both can be blended separately. The Viognier adds a level of softness to the Shiraz and gives the wine a great perfumed aroma. Cool climate regions such as Orange are producing excellent examples.

A beautifully made desert wine is a masterpiece of the winemaker's art. Some dessert wines are the result of 'noble rot' or 'botrytis': a fungus that causes the sweetness. Others are the result of a late harvest, where the sugar levels build up naturally. Most are made from Riesling, Semillon and Gewurztraminer. They taste rich and honeyed and have dense textures.
